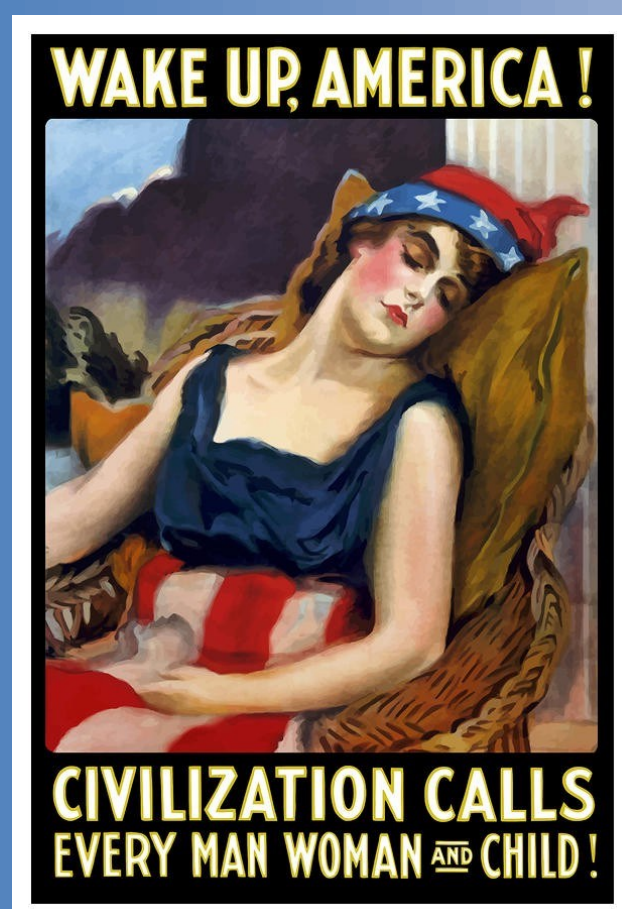
This multi-media presentation explores the unprecedented and shocking cost of WWI and examines its impact on culture, art, literature and politics.
