Leominster Public Library Cormier Center for Young Adults Usage Policy

Rationale: This policy is to inform patrons of the rules and regulations regarding the Cormier Center for Young Adults.

Policy Statement: The Leominster Public Library recognizes the importance of providing young adults with a safe and comfortable environment that prioritizes their interests and needs.

Guidelines for use of the Cormier Center for Young Adults:

- The Cormier Center for Young Adults is a space for patrons in grades 7-12. For the comfort and safety of teen patrons, individuals younger and older may only use the room to browse for and check out materials.
 - Per the Child Safety Policy, caregivers must accompany children under the age of 10 in the Cormier Center, but time should be limited to the selection and check out of materials.
 - Teens caring for children under the age of 10 may be asked to leave the Cormier Center for another area of the library.
- The attendance of teen programs is limited to individuals in grades 7-12. For the comfort and safety of teen patrons, individuals younger and older are prohibited from attending teen programs. This does not apply to programs designed to be multigenerational.
- Food and drink are permitted at the diner tables. If the diner tables are not available, patrons are advised to use the café tables on the first floor.
- When the Cormier Center for Young Adults is closed, patrons may only access the room to browse for materials. Their time should be limited to the browsing of materials.
- Patrons that do not adhere to the Cormier Center Policy may be asked to leave the Cormier Center.
