We had **206,304** visitors in our building this year!

Hosted **565** programs, classes, and events which were attended by **16,963** patrons of all ages

BY THE NUMBERS

Total Municipal Budget:	\$1,484,713
State Aid Award:	\$67,602
Library Friends:	\$31,768
